Dear Senior,

Well, May is almost upon us and we have several things to do for Senior Sunday in the next couple of weeks.

SENIOR DISPLAYS (Setup on Sunday morning, May 5<sup>th</sup> before worship)

These displays are intended to celebrate your life. Some suggestions for decorating your display are pictures, trophies, certificates, favorite toy growing up, favorite candy, and other items that celebrate your life. We will provide you with a tri-fold display board. You can come by and get one from my office or the youth room. We will have tables set up for you. Each person gets half of a 30" x 72" table for your senior display. The displays will be out all day on Sunday (including the morning Recognition Service and the Banquet) for people to see.

IN WORSHIP SERVICE & DURING CLASS (Sunday, May 5<sup>th</sup>)

During the morning service, we will spend time honoring you. After the sermon, we will call you up one at a time and present your Bible to you. I'd like you to wear your cap and gown when we call you up front. However, this needs to be an "all or none" kind of deal. If one of the seniors doesn't have their cap and gown that morning or doesn't want to, everyone will just walk up in the clothes you have on. After morning services, we will encourage people to go visit with you near your display.

AT THE BANQUET (Sunday, May 5<sup>th</sup>)

We will host our Senior Banquet in the Gym at 6pm. A letter from your parents will be read/played during the slide show of pictures of you. I'm also asking YOU to write & record a short, 1-page (front) letter to your parent(s). You can express gratitude, appreciation, or anything else you would like to say to your parent(s). Your letter will be played after your parent's letter has been read. I need this absolutely no later than Sunday, April 28<sup>th</sup>. You can record it on your phone and then email the letter and audio file to me. Again, please plan on having this letter completed **absolutely no later than Sunday evening, April 28<sup>th</sup>**.

AT THE LAST HS DEVO (Sunday, May 19<sup>th</sup>)

Our younger teens will have the opportunity to express their appreciation to you in various ways. ***The next two things are to remain a secret until that day AND will serve as part of your legacy within the group.***

1) I'd like you to give something to the youth group that represents you, your personality, your role in the group, your favorite thing about the group, or whatever you would like. This allows each of you to "leave your mark" on the group in a very permanent and concrete way. Don't feel the need to buy something. If you're unsure about what to leave, talk to me and I can give you some suggestions. We have a special area reserved in the BYG Room for these gifts so be thinking about exactly what you would like to leave.

2) During the devo, you will receive a candle to give to a member of the youth group. The candle you give serves as a "passing on the torch" for that person to carry on (in leadership, service, example, humor, etc.) in your stead. Be prepared to briefly explain why they are receiving the candle from you.
